In the Classroom	- Model Music Curriculum has been considered when developing curriculum with a core musical instrument being taught (Glockenspiel in Year 3/4 on a two-yearly rolling programme) - Music is timetabled for an hour a week, for a minimum of 24 hours across the year - Music curriculum is established with clear intent and progression of skills (4 units of work per year which builds progressively using the Kapow Scheme). - Teacher confidence in music is improving.	- Staff confidence in delivery of music is improving, but continued CPD would be beneficial. - Assessment of the music curriculum is informal.	- Develop opportunities for teachers to work with teachers of music using the same scheme. - CPD through Kapow Scheme. - Develop efficient and accurate assessment systems for music – based on end of unit assessments and PITA scores. Extra-curricular	- Peripatetic music lessons through Derbyshire Music Hub either 1-1 or small groups available to all children in guitar, woodwind or brass instrument learning at a cost to parents. School support with this for children in receipt of Pupil Premium. - Choir open to all pupils who want to attend (Young Voices Club). - Lunchtime space available for pupils wanting to rehearse.	Broaden opportunities for wider musical experiences in school.	Explore other avenues of musical clubs or teachers within school.	July 27
Musical Experiences	- Young Voices concert/choir – all pupils who want to attend can participate and watch a live music performance - Christmas performances for the local pensioners and parents (singing and playing musical instruments) - School talent show open to all pupils - to participate. - Performance for parents of leaving children – participating - Live performances in school from peripatetic music teachers - Regular singing assembly	Pupils' musical experience is limited to internal performances and the experiences are often similar.	Map out musical opportunities across the two-yearly rolling programme to ensure a variety of experiences are available to pupils (particularly as an audience member)	July 27
